








Overseas sales

Recalls & Defects



Improving Safety On Our Highways NHTSA encourages complaints from vehicle owners and drivers, conducts defect investigations and administers safety recalls to support its mission to improve safety on our nation's highways.

- Problem:
 - NHTSA does not provide clear guidance on what aspects of vocational trucks should be subject to recall.
 - Fire apparatus manufacturers are inconsistent in their approach.
- Solution
 - FAMA can create an interpretation that we call all follow to provide consistency and establish precedents


