
### **Largest Drivers of Income Change**





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

# Reporting Requirements

- 2007 Goals to update the bylaws
  - 4 amendments approved in the spring
  - 2 amendments proposed for the fall meeting



# Bylaw Amendment Process

- Committee prepares amendments
- Legal reviews/changes/concurs
- Board reviews/changes/concurs
- Mailed to membership (30) days prior to a General Membership meeting
- Approval by 2/3 of members present



### Amendment #1

- Section 4.2 Default currently reads:
  - Any member who fails to pay dues or an assessment with thirty (30) days after such dues or assessment become due shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of such delinquency and shall be suspended automatically from FAMA activities, including but not limited to general membership and committee meetings, until the delinquency has been cured. If such dues or assessments are not paid within thirty (30) days after the effective date of the suspension (60 days after original due date), the suspended member shall be expelled automatically from membership and may not rejoin except upon compliance with Section 4.4"

### Rationale for Amendment

The amendment is to change the word "expelled" and state that the member company's membership has "expired" rather than to be as harsh in the description. Since the most common cause for termination is for non-payment of annual dues, it is recommended that the language be changed to reflect an expiration of the membership.



# Proposed Amendment #1

"...if such dues or assessments are not paid within thirty (30) days after the effective date of the suspension (60 days after original due date), the suspended member's membership shall expire automatically and the company may not rejoin except upon compliance with Section 4.4."



#### Amendment #2

- Section 7.4.1 Presidential Vacancy
- Currently reads:
  - "If the office of the President should be vacated for any reason, the Vice President shall assume the position of President and serve out the balance of the former President's term. At the completion of that term, the former Vice President will continue as President and serve the next full year term as President. The vacated Vice President's position shall be filled in accordance with Section 7.4.2"



### Rationale for Amendment

• There is no provision for filling the vacancy of the President if the former Vice President cannot fulfill the original President's term. If the former Vice President serves out the vacated President's term but cannot serve out the next full term, the President's position would be filled by the Vice President per Section 7.4.2.



# Proposed Amendment #2

- Add to the end of Section 7.4.1
  - "If the former Vice President is unable to complete the vacated President's term, the Past President chosen to serve out the vacated Vice President's term shall become President for the balance of the original term. For the the following year in which the former Vice President was to serve his/her scheduled full term as President, the Board of Directors shall, at a regular or special meeting call for that purpose, select a Past President to be the President for the full year's term based on a majority vote, a quorum being present."

#### **Tech Committee Mission Statement**

To research, recommend and represent member organizations on technical issues related to the manufacture of fire apparatus with the goal of constant improvement to product and safety for the end user. This shall be done in a manner consistent with anti-trust regulations.

## Chassis

- Anthropometric Study Update
  - Ready for release to the web site
- Exhaust Temperature Mitigation Comment
  - There is a pending NFPA requirement for exhaust temperature mitigation, but no target values.
  - Several suggestions were made to modify the pending requirement but no agreements were reached.
  - Group could not reach consensus. Will submit as a public comment.



#### Chassis Committee

#### FMVSS 121 Stopping Distance Update

- NHTSA is making changes to FMVSS 121 reducing the required stopping distance for combination vehicles.
  - In 2008, a decision will be made if straight trucks will be pursued
- Wording relating to "severe service vehicles" may be added that may provide relief if changes to straight trucks are pursued.
- This needs to be closely monitored over the next few years.



#### Chassis Committee

- 2010 Engine Change Planning
  - Engine OEM tour planned for October 23-25
  - Possible industry exemptions may be sought

#### Vehicle Stability NFPA Comment

 A modification to the vehicle stability wording was agreed to by the committee and will be submitted for the planned changes to NFPA 1901.



## Body

#### Vehicle Stability NFPA Comment

- Body Committee proposed a change to this Standard which differs from that of the Chassis Committee proposal.
- Committees will work out the differences to come to an agreement.



## Hi Voltage Electrical

- Proposal 164 to isolate the ground and neutral (currently bonded at the power supply) was reversed and will remain as worded in the current edition.
- Proposal 163 to change voltage limits to +/- 5% instead of +/- 10% was reversed and will remain as worded in the current edition.
- Proposal 163 to add comments to the annex regarding GFCIs will remain as an Annex item. Each member should review the GFCI annex text and submit comments.
- Individuals were encouraged to submit comments to NFPA by August 31 and prompted to attend the NFPA 1901 meeting in Denver, October 11-13 to support our position/comments.



## Low Voltage Electrical

- Vehicle Data Recorded (VDR)
  - Recommendation to further define the proposed VDR language
  - The SAE has an Event Data Recorder task force in the process of developing a recommended practice for data recorders which will apply to all on-highway vehicles including fire apparatus. The committee will monitor and/or participate in the SAE task force and apprise FAMA of their direction and progress.



## Low Voltage Electrical

- Proposal 13.3.3.2 Minimum continuous DC current rating for trailer interconnects.
  - Review of comment suggesting 45A rating too high for DOT loads.
  - Committee recommends language be changed to set minimums based on trailer size/weight.



#### Foam

- No action recommended by the committee on the RFP
- Still Under Review
  - Viscosity issues of foam and effects on calibration and accuracy of the proportioning system
- New Considerations Under Review:
  - Require All Fire Apparatus to have a foam system.
  - Require All Municipal Trucks to have at least one water-only discharge line.
  - Require All Foam systems to have an automatic fill system to a vehicle mounted tank.
  - Require Foam Concentrates to have color coded features.



#### ARFF

- FAA 10-D document is complete and at legal for review.
   Should be published within the next 30 days
  - Over 300 comments were received and ALL will be addressed.
  - NFPA 414 will be the base standard with FAA exceptions specified.
    - FAA references its own Advisory Circulars regarding lighting, striping, FLIR camera systems, etc... NOT other NFPA documents.
  - Confusion is anticipated when the new document is published.
  - ARFF group will review the new 10-D document and may request NFPA to short cycle the 414 document to make it consistent with the FAA exceptions.



### ARFF

- The IAFF has petitioned congress to support legislation that will:
  - Call for minimum staffing of ARFF vehicles to 4 persons per vehicle.
  - Adapt the ICAO standard for the number and type of vehicle required at each airport.
    - ICAO generally requires more vehicles for a given size airport than the current FAA standard.



## Safety

- Seat Belt Audible Warning Proposal needs to be addressed
  - How long will it stay on?
  - Commercial chassis will need an exception
  - Recommended proposal be moved Appendix item
    - If available on chassis FD should consider requiring seat belt monitoring.
- 4.11.2 UDA(?) Data
  - Availability on commercial chassis not clear
  - May require separate sensors and tapping into vehicle harness.
  - Issues with maintaining software changes/updates for all operating systems



## Pumps & Plumbing

- Non-moveable exhaust components cause some installation problems which necessitate plumbing modifications
  - PTO drive not as accessible.
  - Pump and plumbing space and routing issues.






